MORE TOUR NEWS (and you read it here first!)

Don Williams is confirmed for concert and club dates in March/April - a few year since his big hits but still lots of loyal fans for his (extremely) laid back sound. Ditto frequent visitor Freddy Fender who this time is travelling with fellow Texas Tornado, Augie Meyer plus the 'Harper Valley PTA' girl Jeannie C. Riley; if my memory serves me correctly she was last here in 1973 at which time she'd just 'found God' - contractually I believe this time HE won't be making an appearance!

Now, the hot ticket is, a certain superstar set for a one-off show somewhere 'back of Bourke', all I can say is it's 'opal less' to think there may be further shows as sure as my name (isn't) 'Lightning Jack' and son, you can take that as 'ridgey didge'!! Well, after that cryptic concoction back to 'the real world' (I can't stop) - Guy Clark, one of the great songwriters is here in March and Jimmie Dale Gilmore in April, so save those pennies. A pity Keith Richard won't be able to perform his duet with George Jones (from the new album, 'The Bradley Barn Sessions') whilst here with The Rolling Stones but for the price of a ticket to the above you could see Guy perform 4 times and still have enough left over to see Jimmie!

Of course another way to hear music is the radio - in Sydney 2SER, 2VTR, 2RRR and others play country on a regular basis. (Check out Ken Date - Sydney's most opinionated country DJ on 2RRR Saturday mornings 88.5FM). In Melbourne recently a 24 hour country station 'NU-Country 93.4' began test broadcasts, leading up to a hopeful full license in February. Using a playlist format for most of it's on air time, it

showed what can be done with very little except enthusiasm - scary thing was it's better than 2SM ever was!

Another way of promoting country is in print and we are set for not one, but two new publications beginning February next year. Max King, having worked his way through promotion, managing and radio presentation (remember his charismatic 2KY slot) has now arrived at the pinnacle - Media Magnate. His 'Free Country Music Magazine' will hit the streets 1 March 1995 with a promise of reaching 47,000 readers in the greater Sydney area - MEANWHILE 'Total Country', under the editorial of David Latta, is set for newsagent distribution around the same time, a transaction with the store will be necessary for the procurement of this one!

I wish them both well and hope for some critical component in both - the trouble with the somewhat lamented 'Australian Country Music Mag' was it was an 'everything's good' type mag and that approach stifles the development of constructive progression in the country music area - if you are afraid to voice a negative then your positive won't be worth much and let's face it, there is a lot of room for improvement in certain areas of the country music scene - the dilemma is, for example, should we be thankful just to have a show like 'Stampede' even though the compere (and most of the content) is totally inadequate or should we try to improve it?

Anyone who went to see Billy Joel on his recent Australian tour probably wouldn't have seen his 'national support act' Troy Cassar-Daley. Seems he was bumped from the bill after two shows for being - yes, you guessed it - too country!!! ('Bullish' behaviour from the promoter!)

Finally, anyone want to *not* lay odds on Gina Jeffries being 'top female' artist and folk/balladeer John Williamson being 'male' at this year's Tamworth awards? Will a certain female folk/balladeer congratulate her, after saying several years ago some very unkind words on her dress style in order to win 'Starmaker? Will 'Willo' thank his grammar teacher at Scotch (sic) College?

These and many other questions will probably never be answered but if they are, the Phantom will be there!



Hot from BMG ARISTA comes another swag of new releases. One Emotion by Clint Black (produced by James Stroud and Clint himself), is undoubtedly one to look out for this summer.

'One Emotion' contains aid back Clint Black ballads with some more rocky numbers in 'Summer Comin', 'I Can Get By' and 'Hey Hot Rod'. My favourite though is the raunchy 'A Good Run of Bad Luck' with Clint beltin' out some great harmonica and Stuart Duncan on fiddle. Wynona Judd also gets a look in doing a duet with Clint - seems to be the in thing these days. A touch of Aaron Neville and Linda Rondstat here.

 Watch out for the dance Swamp Stomp to the song 'Summer's Comin'.

From John Denver comes the CD 'A Portrait - 25 years' with many timeless classics, such as 'Rocky Mountain High', 'Calypso' and many, many more. I don't think there would be any CD collection, no matter what persuasion, that didn't contain a John Denver CD.

Those regular listeners to Robyn Skinner on 2RRR 88.5FM on Sunday mornings would have heard Terry McBride and The Ride's latest self titled CD. My favourite is track 2 - 'I Can't Dance', this one is especially for the two-steppers.

McBride knows how to cut lose and kick out the lights. He also sings with emotion and passion and that takes everything soaring to another plane Produced by Josh Leo, Terry McBride and The Ride offer some great listening.

Also out now is Brooks & Dunn 3, 'Waitin' on Sundown'. B & D fans (no not bondage and discipline) will be falling over themselves to get hold of this one and start dancing. Ever since Brooks & Dunn put the bootscoot into boogie, country music has never be the same. STOP PRESS ... Audio Murphy Inc - Too Hot For Tamworth

It was announced on 11 November 1994 that the Country Music Association of Australia ('CMAA') had rejected nominations for awards relating to Audio Murphy Inc (featuring Melinda) and their current chart hit single 'Tighten Up Your Pants'.

No written statement was issued by the CMAA but it is believed that their non-eligibility was due to the song not being traditionally country.

Audio Murphy Inc have accepted this decision on the chin but are said to be bitterly disappointed and will now reconsider an invitation to perform in Tamworth next year (where 'Tighten Up Your Pants' is a huge hit in the clubs).

The rejection by the CMAA has come hot on the heels of 'Tighten Up Your Pants' receiving rave reviews from ANR executives in the US and UK. All the US labels are confident of a hit from New York to LA to Nashville.

Come on Tamworth, loosen up those pants! Ed.

Giant Country Christmas

Any album featuring the likes of Carlene Carter, Dennis Robbins, Clay Walker can't be all bad.

Alan Jackson - Who I am

Is commentary really necessary? 13 tracks, 'Summertime Blues' is given the 'Chattahoochie' treatment. The tearaway 'I Don't Even Know Your Name' is very fun to boot and he shows a great touch on 2 covers: the Kendalls' 'Thank God for the Radio' and Rodney Crowell's 'Song For Life', 'Job Description' is an insight into life on the road. Only the most ultra conservative would think twice about getting an A.J. album.

Gina Jeffries -The Flame

Gina is certainly a talented and vivacious young lady but unfortunately this album is not as successful as it should have been. What it lacks is direction. There are too many throwaways such as 'Girl's Night Out' and her cover of the Forester Sisters' song 'Men'.

She seems uncomfortable with 'My Shoes KeepWalking Back to You' and is somewhat strained on Hugh Moffatt's 'Last Night I Dreamed of Loving You'. She is more convincing on 'Standing too Close to the Flame' but she probably saves the best for last on 'Two Stars Fell', which is the sole track produced by Doug Trevor. Maybe Doug should have been given the project ahead of Garth Porter.

The production is disappointing especially considering Porter's sterling work with Lee Kernaghun. The drums are too overpowering for a start. Only occasionally he hits the mark such as 'I Don't Want This Night to Be Over'. This is not a bad album. It should have been better.

Red Hot and Country

This is a compilation album, good value at 67 minutes, but not all is good, in fact a couple of songs are pretty awful, but the goods far outweigh the bads. This is an AIDS awareness project and the songs represent artists paying tribute to certain of their influences.

Suzy Bogguss, Alison Krauss and Kathy Mattea harmonise with Crosby, Stills and Nash on 'Teach Your Children'. Dig a hole for Sammy Kershaw's 'Fire and Rain' (it deserves to be buried). Brooks and Dunn combine with Johnny Cash for a fine 'Folsom Prison Blues' whilst JC returns for a version of the Bob Dylan song 'Forever Young'.

Carl Perkins/Duane Eddy and the Mavericks do a spot on romping 'Matchbox'; Jimmie Dale Gilmore combines with Willie on a great eccentric version of 'Crazy', whilst possibly the best 2 tracks are Doll's 'You Gotta Be My Baby' (of course a George Jones song) and Radney Foster's romp through the Burrito Brothers via Charlie Walker's version of 'Close All the Honky Tonks' (RADNEY FANS NOTE: his new album which was due out on 30 August has been postponed to an unknown date).

Finally, Mark Chesnutt again shows off his wonderful voice on 'Goodbye Comes Hard to Me'. Even Billy Ray is quite good. 17 tracks of which I would say 12 were in the good plus category.




