



Somewhere Out There (rooArt)

The Imminent release of Shanley Del's new single "Somewhere Out There" will add fuel to the fire that has been burning since the release of her critically acclaimed release "What's A Heartache For?"

The song was recorded in Australia and co-written with South Carolina native **Stowe Dalley**. Produced by Shanley's "pop diva" sister **Jenny Morris**, it is indicitive of the direction in which Shanley is moving.

Captured / Ambush



COPYRIGHT (PART 2) AMCOS

The Australasian Mechanical Copyright Owners Society ("AMCOS") represents virtually all music publishers in Australia and New Zealand and, by way of reciprocal arrangements. the vast majority of the world's composers, writers and music publishers. As the licensing arm of the Australian Music Publishers Association Limited ("AMPAL") AMCOS can authorise the copying of music swiftly and efficiently, often by-passing the need for negotiation with individual music publishers. So why can't I just copy music onto a cassette? Essentially, music copyright exists as a means to encourage creativity and to protect the artistic and intellectual efforts of the originators of musical works. Copyright is the life blood of the music industry. It is designed to ensure that composers of musical works and authors of any associated lyrics are appropriately PAID when their works are used. Australia, like most countries, has a legally regulated system to govern the use of copyright material and to strike a balance between the rights of those who own copyright material and the interests of those who want to use it. Copyright in a musical work extends from the time it is first fixed in a material form, to 50 years from the end of the year in which the writer died. Like any other piece of property, copyright can be bought, sold, hired, willed to a beneficiary or given away. It is thus possible for the entire bundle of rights to change The unauthorised copying of a "substantial part" of a musical work infringes copyright. A "substantial part" can be as brief as a few seconds if the idea of the original work can be conveyed in that time. Music and lyrics are separate copyrights so the unauthorised copyright of a song can incur penalties for more than one infringement. The finished result of any recording session is protected by copyright. HERE, the copyright is in the recording of the work in addition to the work itself. separate licenses must be obtained for the copying of that recording - one for the reproduction of the musical work and another for

the reproduction of the sound recording. All reproductions of musical work require the licence of the copyright owner. The term "Mechanical Copyright" dates back to the early 1900s when records were first made. This was a "mechanical" process and a "mechanical royalty" was due to the copyright owner for every sale of a "mechanical" reproduction. Today, the term is still used even though reproduction on CD, tape, or any other audio format is an electronic process. In Australia and New Zealand the administration of these mechanical rights and certain other reproduction rights, is carried out by AMCOS. Musical works may also be reproduced within a variety of formats other than audio. Many of these can be handled simply and efficiently by AMCOS. So, a line dancing club that wants to make a cassette compilation of songs copied from commercial recordings, needs to secure a licence from AMCOS by completing a Mechanical Copyright Licence application for the reproduction of the musical works and needs to contact ARIA (Australian Record Industry Association) to secure a licence for the reproduction of the sound recordings. In most cases, where a tape is being made for the club's own use and is NOT being made to be sold, the total of both licenses (AMCOS and ARIA) should be around \$20.00 to \$25.00. AMCOS advises that on the subject of dance schools some line dancing clubs have made inquiries about the AMCOS/ARIA dance school licence which allows an unlimited number of tapes to be made in a calendar year by paying a rate per student. Unfortunately, this licence is not available to line dancing clubs or any other party whatsoever for the following reasons:

- the entity being licensed must be a bona fide dance school;
- the teachers MUST be properly qualified and accredited;
- students must be registered with the dance school for a course of instruction; and
- students follow a syllabus and are prepared for eisteddfods and dance competitions.

A Beginners Look at Line Dancing Ra S. & Voloncino

Have you ever thought of trying line dancing or bootscootin', "that - looks - like - fun". Country style dancing whose best feature is that you don't need a partner. Well, get those well-loved jeans out of the wash and head for your nearest venue to have an updated, old fashioned good time. Line dancing is an execellent activity for all ages and for the whole family. The cost is either free or within the reach of modest pockets.

Line dancing is a cross of folk, square and ballroom dance steps done to mostly country music. It is performed with dancers in lines all facing the same direction and the steps are designed to rotate you to the 4 corners of the compass so that you face every wall in a room during a dance. The pattern is repeated every 48 beats for most dances so even the most tentative tripper can manage to learn very quickly.

Line dancing has been a recreational activity in Australia for around 8 years. There are line dance groups and venues and events all over the country from Tasmania to Wagga Wagga to the Northern Territory, with an annual celebration at Tamworth. If you are a Jack or Jill come lately (like me) you'll be entering into some fairly well oiled machinery.

I can tell you a bit about what it is like to be a rank beginner because I just recently gave it a go. It was a bit like taking a foreign language having missed the first semester. Everyone in the class was already into conversation phrases while I was still pointing to objects and translating their names, except in this case it was translating a word that entered somewhere near the top of my body and was supposed to come out somewhere near the lower part in a movement. Never mind that there is music involved, a third reference point, a sort of buoy thrown to the drowning dancer.

It's not that beginners aren't welcome. I found the participants to be absolutely friendly and happy to see you. It's just that they've come

to dance and that means they're quite busy doing the most steps they can remember, to the most dances they can fit in depending on their level of fitness. In between, they'll have time to answer a few questions for you and even help untangle your right foot from your left, but in general at major dance venues there isn't a lot of time spent in formal teaching.

In a 2 to 3 hour open dance session there may be 1 or 2 dances taught. This consists of an instructor lining up on the floor with you and talking and walking everyone through a set pattern of steps which usually is repeated as many as 8 times during a dance. There is much encouragement about how you will get it on about the 3rd time through. My only problem was trying to recall when the dance came up again, 5 songs later, where I'd seen it before. You can boost your speed in learning new dances by attending classes as well as the open Classes are easier in one way and harder in another. The easy part is that every dance is guided by the instructor. The hard part is that every dance is guided by the instructor!!! If, like me, you aren't quite in olympic condition just yet, a couple of hours straight of sliding. kicking, turning, twisting, hopping, swinging, stomping, clapping and hee-hawing will be noticed by some parts of your body, notably all the "H" body parts - Heart, Hips, Head, Heels, Helbows and Hernial membranes. Somehow the music just picks you up again and again. I tried to sit out a dance or 2, the instructors are wonderful in encouraging you to go at your own pace, but the music kept tugging on my feet and before I knew it I was back in again.

At the dances, the best thing to "up" the ante of your learning is to pick out a couple of dancers who seem to know the steps and play "monkey see, monkey do". Of course, your execution is miserable at first but no-one gives a darn and after a while even a small series of correct steps is reward enough. I'm a great believer in throwing the brain and body into the fray and letting them sort out how the game is Line dancing is perfect for the methodology. The only possible humiliating moment comes when you realise that the whole line of dancers has executed 3 sides of the square and are now all lined up behind you facing your backside. Don't panic.

already learned that you don't know your hitch from your "get a long" and aren't going to be looking at your feet at all. The only problem you can cause in this situation is getting a crick in your neck trying to look over your shoulder for a clue of what you should be doing.

You may find that wearing your favourite jeans and stomping cowboy boots and dressing up in all sorts of western clobber is an attraction you can't resist. For those who like to go whole hog city - you can top your outfit off with a fabulous cowboy hat. While dancing, thumbs are hooked inside the belt of your jeans. This finishes the smart look of the urban cowboy. Very sassy, particularly with the plentiful bum wagging steps and stomps. Actually, you can wear just about anything you like. Let's not forget, this is Australia and jeans and a t-shirt will do the job nearly every time. The only rule is you need slick soled shoes so you can slide and not stick.

All ready now to bronco twist, strut, rock an kick ball change? You'll have a good of time and remembering these bits of advice from "A Cowgirt's Guide to Life" by Gladiola Montana can't hurt: "You'll make better progress if you get out of your own way" and "don't squat with your spurs on".

Dear Ed.

I'd just like to say I whole heartedly agree with the comments of Lee Courtwood (Sept/Oct issue). If it hadn't been for a lot of hard working people who just wished to share what they had learned (the teachers who are only one or two dances ahead of their students), line dancing would still be struggling for acceptance in many parts of Australia - especially rural areas. started off in that way over 2 years ago, but now I'm many dances ahead of my students, mainly because I have relocated. The area I relocated from was where I started teaching line dancing and at that time it had not been heard of there. As time went on and there became more demand for us to teach, then our time ran out, we encouraged many of our students to get out there and share what they knew. They were still my students, coming to the intermediate and advanced classes that I conducted, and then the rest of the week they went out teaching. They did (and do) a great job (mostly), and I can only compliment them on having the courage to go do it when they were only a dance or two ahead of their classes. I believe that at least 90% of all teachers either started out this way or are still teaching in this manner. I must admit that I think some people don't do a very good job but they still attract students. Some people have pride in what they do and some don't, same anywhere in society. I am even aware that there are some teachers out there (usually without much support) who learnt 10 to 12 dances from another teacher and then took off by themselves to teach. They just continually teach these same dances. They simply teach at the level they can manage. I suppose there is even a need for this type of teacher - although I really don't approve of this. I still believe if you are going to teach you really owe it to yourself and your students to keep upgrading. I would expect that this type of teacher could only stay in the system a limited time (until there is no more money to be made). There are different levels required and available, to suit the various students' needs. I guess it's like choosing a doctor, you either like him/her or you don't. If you don't you find another doctor or a specialist. Same with line dancing, most students find a teacher that suits them. important thing is that, they DO have a choice. I

like Lee's comments regarding the insecurities of some teachers - absolutely spot on. Unfortunately, humans have a tendency to be like that in many fields of endeavour. Line dancing is certainly no different. Many forget where they came from and the real reasons for teaching. Money and power become the major issues and seem to spoil things. I have seen attitude changes many times. Such a shame, but that's the way it will probably remain. All that's left for me to add, as long as the majority stay happy, have fun and remember that they are dealing with people, there is not much else we can expect.


